#### **Our Source of Light**

January 6 marks the day of Epiphany, when the wise men (who were Gentiles) came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world.

Ponder the gifts of Epiphany with these two reflections, written centuries apart:

Your light, dear God, surpasses all other light, because all light comes from you. Your fire surpasses all fire, because your fire alone burns without destroying. The flames of your fire reach into the soul, consuming the sin and selfishness that lie there. But far from damaging the soul, your fire sets it ablaze with love. What moved you to enlighten me with your truth? The fire of your love was the reason. You loved me so much that you could not bear to see me confused and perplexed. Can I ever repay the burning love which you have given me? No, because I have nothing of my own to give. Yet you assure me that the love which you put into my soul is repayment enough. You desire only the joy of seeing me receiving your gift. What more perfect Father could there be!

## GIVE YOUR BRAIN A WORKOUT!

#### 5 Fun Activities To Give Your Brain A Workout

Despite a lack of conclusive evidence, many experts believe mental activity can help slow or prevent Alzheimer's disease (AD).

The importance of mental stimulation in preventing or delaying age-related cognitive decline is still a matter of debate. A number of studies have suggested that mental activity can help keep the brain sharp, while others have found no evidence that exercising the brain improves cognition. Since there isn't yet a magic bullet that can cure diseases like AD, delaying the possible onset of mental decline by keeping the mind stimulated seems to be an excellent idea. Other measures, such as eating a healthy, low-fat diet with plenty of fresh fruits and vegetables, exercising regularly, managing cardiovascular conditions such as high blood pressure, and seeking help for mood disorders, are also important in maintaining optimal brain function.

The beneficial effects of mental stimulation appear to be related to its association with increases in neurogenesis (the production and survival of new nerve cells) and brain plasticity (the growth of new connections among brain cells) in areas of the brain responsible for learning and memory. The stimulating mental exercises that follow are intended to give your gray cells a workout:

**Challenge 1:** Find the three *consecutive* letters of the alphabet that can be added as a unit to the lettes AME to form a six-letter word. Do the same with letters ATE and ACK. Can you think of other, similar combinations?

Challenge 2: Draw a large square and divide it into 36 equal squares. Distribute 12 buttons on this "game board" so that there is only one button to a square, and a total of two buttons to each diagonal, column, and row. There are multiple solutions to this puzzle – how many can you find?

Challenge 3: Name three animals beginning with each letter of your full name, using different animals each time. Repeat the exercise with objects, geographical locations, plants, and so forth. For a bigger challenge, try to find four or five items for each letter.

Challenge 4: Memorize the 50 states in the Union. Once you've mastered the list, memorize their capitals and locations on a map of the United States. Now recite the 50 states in alphabetical order. The recite them in reverse alphabetical order.

Challenge 5: While you are waiting for an appointment, look around you and, giving yourself one minute, try to find five black objects that will fit into your pocket or your purse, and five blue objects that are too big to fit.






#### From the Deacons:


We will receive the Sacrament of Communion on Sunday, January 7th. All who trust in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are invited to partake.


#### PINE SPRINGS INK CARTRIDGE PROGRAM

#### What you need:

 Clean cardboard egg carton



- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush

## GIVE

#### What you do:

- Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.
